

HERITAGE STATEMENT  
Star Inn, Eastbourne

The Star Inn, Star Road, Eastbourne, East Sussex The Star is all that remains of the Old Star Brewery which was established on this site in 1777 using the waters of the nearby Bourne Stream. The brewery was taken over by Courage in 1965 and closed shortly afterwards. The Brewery and surrounding buildings were demolished in 1973.

This traditional local is a double-fronted Grade 11 listed building and is all that remains of the Star Brewery which brewed from 1777 to 1967. A two-sided bar serves two separate rooms; one with fascinating murals and a small stage for live music; the other bar has a darts board, pool table and bar billiards. Reopened under new management in June 2014.

The signage will indicate both the buildings' function and the access points to both foot and vehicular traffic at distance, also creating a better flow of traffic for users of the outlet.

The signage has been designed using traditional materials and processes. The use of colours and letter styles has been chosen to be traditional but not overpowering against the building's aesthetics. Every care has been taken to ensure that this design will complement the building and be in keeping with the surrounding area. The signage pays respect to the heritage of the building.
